As the new year begins on 1 April, we are asking that treasurers collect the annual subs in March and April and send us the county and national portions as soon as possible. Any subs collected after this should go on the green form.

The subscription for the year commencing 1 April 2024 is £48, set by National. £11.30 goes to the Federation and £13.10 to NFWI. The remaining £23.60 is the WI's portion. However, WIs can now decide how much of their portion they wish to charge their members. The decision can be made to waive the full amount, or to reduce it. When your committee is considering this, please remember that the WI must also pay Pooling of Fares, Annual Meeting Contribution and insurance for each member.


DENMAN NEWS - THE WI LEARNING HUB

ROADE Saturday 13 April 2024, 9.45am for 10.00am start. Approx 5 miles


