### LEARNING HUB

Having attended courses at Denman, I was very sad when it closed as it was such a special place of quality learning. Though often the complaint heard was that it wasn't central for everyone to attend, being based near Oxford.

Then the learning hub started. If you are a WI member the learning hub is free and most courses are set for 60-90 minutes though some run for longer than one week. If you cannot make a live course you can watch the recording on catch up over the following week. This is also useful if you want to go back and watch the recording again to grasp a skill. I completed the hexie cardigan course over 2 weeks but watched it again on catch up, to check what I was doing. There are live courses, recorded courses, the learning library and the WI roles area.

## Littlethorpe Manor Gardens Visit on 19th June

It was on a lovely warm sunny morning that 25 ladies gathered for a tour of Littlethorpe Manor Gardens. We were greeted first with refreshments in the marquee, before Eddie Harland, Head Gardener, introduced the tour by telling us that Mr and Mrs Thackray moved into the Manor in 1985. Mr Thackray sadly passed away in 2018, but Mrs Thackray is still in residence. Eddie has been the Head Gardener for nearly 30 years, and there has been huge development of the gardens in that time. There are 4 acres of formal gardens and 7 acres of managed parkland.

We were led around the different sections, with Eddie explaining the theme of each garden, the symbolism, and what plants had been used. His extensive knowledge was very impressive. Of note were the walled garden, set out to represent the 4 seasons, and the sunken garden. Also of particular note was the Physic Garden, which was created in memory of Mr Thackray, and the family company which began by manufacturing bandages, before moving on to surgical instruments and prosthetic joints. Indeed, something we were not expecting to see was a tall metallic sculpture of a total hip replacement!

One of many highlights was the large pond, complete with pavilion. The water lilies of varying shades were beautiful, with many damselflies in evidence. The gardens attract many birds, bees and butterflies. The gardens are beautiful, tranquil and peaceful and well worth visiting. After thanking Eddie for an interesting and enjoyable tour, we headed for the plant sales area to take a little of the magic home with us. **Angela Turnbull, Ripon Belles WI.**
