



Tip: Delegates voting at the Annual Meeting – Here is how to do it!

Delegates at the Annual Meeting represent several WIs. They are given a vote per WI that they are representing. Before they Annual Meeting they need to contact each of these WIs who will tell them which way they would like their vote to be cast. WIs can ask them to vote for the resolution, against the resolution or they can give them discretion, meaning that the delegate can decide which way to vote depending on the debate at the meeting. Only votes cast for and against resolutions will be counted, in accordance with the voting procedure set out in the NFWI Memorandum and Articles of Association. Abstaining means that a delegate would not cast a vote, and therefore this abstention would not be counted. As there are two Resolutions this year, don't forget, you don't choose one, you take a decision for each one! If you have any questions, your WI Adviser will be happy to help.

Recipe Corner

A recipe tried and tested at Debbie's Salad workshop last summer



'Apple & Nut Salad'

2 crisp apples

2 tsp lemon juice

1 1/2 oz walnuts

3 fl oz soured cream or Greek Yogurt

2 oz white cabbage

2 sticks celery

6 radishes

1 oz raisins

Salt and pepper

Method - Wash and core the apples, chop into chunks.

Place in bowl and sprinkle with lemon juice.

Roughly chop the walnuts. Put the cream/yogurt into a bowl and stir in the walnuts and apples.

Shred the cabbage. Thinly slice the celery and radishes.

Cut the raisins in half.

Mix all ingredients together, keeping back a few walnuts and radish slices to garnish.

Serve as a side dish – can be chilled in fridge and kept in airtight container.
