> Greenwash: Disinformation disseminated by an organisation to present an environmentally responsible public image.

A new term describes this rise in environmental pessimism:

Doomerism: the belief that it's too late and there's nothing individuals can do about it.

This is reinforced when every day we see headlines about heatwaves, floods, fires, famine etc. that are blamed on Climate Change. This attitude will only make things worse. We must not allow this pessimism and lack of action to take hold.

Remember, as consumers we have power to force change. We are already seeing this in so many ways.

FREE JULY[®] Having followed The Big Plastic Count now is the time

to go Plastic free for a month! This is a global movement and if you sign up on their website you can receive weekly emails containing ideas and to keep you motivated.

Miricroplastics are now being found in freshly fallen Antarctic snow. Plastic is produced by the oil industry and big corporations which may be why it is so difficult to stop production. It is killing wildlife, poisoning the land and we all know the state of the oceans now.

Do you recycle your single use plastic? It can be taken back to some supermarkets and put in their plastic bag bins.



The Big Butterfly count runs from 15 July to 7 August. Check out their website and join in. 50% of our beautiful butterflies are now Red Listed which means that they are in danger of extinction.

Personalised email for your WI

As an officer for your WI do you find your personal email gets cluttered up with emails for your WI?

Is it a chore writing or forwarding messages to all your members?

There are two things you can do to make life simpler:

You can set up a generic email address using gmail.com using your WI name eg villagewi@gmail.com and share login details with the people that need them.

When that is established, you can create a Label within the Contacts ie Members and add this to each member. When that is completed and you need to send or forward a message to everyone you can click on Members in the CC or BCC part of the email and they will all be added.

Setting such an email up require s a back link to another email with a password, so it is a good idea to have these details stored away from the computer so they can be accessed if that person becomes ill, moves away or worst still scenario, dies.

If you have other groups within your WI - Book Group / Craft Group / Walking Group etc, you can label the members who belong to those groups and it is then similarly easy to contact them with one click.

Some WIs have already done this and are finding it time-saving and useful. If you need more help with this contact Judith or Hazel



Would you like a penpal

About 4 years ago, when the WI resolutions of mental health matters and alleviating loneliness had been voted on, Valerie Hughes, from Sutton WI, Norfolk federation, decided that a good way of helping was to set up a WI pen pal group.

It is very therapeutic writing letters, often you may do more or look at things in a different way so that you have plenty to write about. It is also really nice to get a hand written letter as opposed to a bill or circular. Pen pals can be supportive, encouraging, an inspiration, a person to share highs and lows without being interrupted. There is something tangible, something to re-read as often as you want. Getting the word out was difficult as she wanted to keep it as a free service, so went to social media and the UWI FB group (often referred to as The Daisies) for help and a sub group 'The pen pal exchange' was set up. It now has over 1,000 members.

Once successful, National Federation promoted it too, - it is mentioned on MyWi and WI Life has written about it several times.

Although Valerie is aware that potentially the loneliest people are not on line, this is the only way

she can accept applications as she is not able to advertise her postal address for GDPR reasons. She hopes that those who do have internet access will apply for those who don't.

To apply, she asks the following questions and for the answers to be emailed to her. She only shares the applicant's address with the pen pal she matches them to.

- * Name
- * Age
- * Marital status
- * Present or former employment
- * Interests and hobbies
- * A bit about your family
- Full postal address

She aims to link members at the end of every month, hoping that their interests and backgrounds will be a common thread. This is not always easy. She is also mindful of how near members live to each other, as if too close they may already know each other.
