Anglesey Federation - Tree Project Craft Exhibition

In September, Anglesey Federation held an Exhibition at Llangefni Town Hall to display craft items made by members as part of the project. The exhibition was opened by Albert Owen and attended by Margaret Thomas, Mayor of Llangefni.

Powys Brecknock - Tree Planting and Exhibition

Project Co-ordinators in Powys Brecknock organised a display of work by Llangynidr WI to display crafted materials, photographs and poetry made as part of the project.

Llanelwy WI - Clwyd Denbigh Federation

Llanelwy WI featured in the last newsletter as a WI case study. Since then, the group has worked with Afon Elwy Environmental Group for tree planting in a local park. The group planted 28 trees on the banks of the Elwy River, sourced mainly from the Woodland Trust. The WI have also committed to help the Afon Elwy Environmental Group with their community projects in 2020. In total around 14 WI members were involved over the course of the year.

Elsewhere in Clwyd Denbigh, 28 members attended a walk at Conwy Valley Maze and enjoyed a talk about trees growing at the site.



Pembrokeshire Federation - Tree Project Workshop

Members in Pembrokeshire are getting ready to plant trees as part of the project. Over 40 members attended a training day to engage in the project. The federation plan to hold more sessions and are encouraging WIs to look for public areas where trees could be planted (school grounds, community gardens etc.. Ceredigion Federation - Llanilar Woodland Walk

43 members attended an afternoon walk at Llanilar in September.
