Make a Match Since 2019, the number of stem cell donors in the UK has fallen by 62%. There is an urgent need to reverse this trend. September was Blood Cancer Awareness Month and marks the start of a

new Make a Match craft action and members are being asked to create a blood droplet shaped article which may be a felt bag charm, a cross stitch hoop or an applique badge. All can be made at a simple level and are intended as conversation starters. Don't forget, you can recycle materials or use crafting scraps.

A postcard is available for handing out at events and can be used to record contact details of those wishing to learn more about becoming a stem cell donor. It's hoped that some will be available at the Craft Showcase at the Birmingham and Midland Institute (02 Nov 2022).
