York Cookery School – a fabulous day out for Bainbridge WI



On Saturday 3rd September twenty-nine members of Bainbridge Women's Institute enjoyed a most memorable day out at Andrew Thwaites' York Cookery School. Andrew's career has included cooking in prestigious hotels, as well as demonstrating and teaching cookery. He recently bought the York cookery school which offers

a wide range of courses led by visiting chefs and bakers. Andrew himself concentrates on making and teaching about chocolate in the UK and overseas.

Andrew has a long association with Bainbridge WI. Having grown up in Bainbridge, he started his career as a chef at a guest house run by member and former Bainbridge WI president Anne Harrison. He knows many WI members from those days and the invitation to the school

was a special thank you from him for the experience and guidance given to him in those early days. Andrew is a very charismatic, funny, and warm speaker. It is evident that he has very fond memories and friendships from his days in in Bainbridge.

The day started with coffee and biscuits - delicious shortbread biscuits made by Linda Jamieson, expert baker and cake decorator. Linda has her own business Lindy Lou Artisan Cakes in Scarborough and regularly works with Andrew at the cookery school. We had a tour of the school which has impressive cooking and chocolate

preparation areas. William Nicol is a chef and instructor who also regularly works with Andrew, he demonstrated how to make Fish En Papillote (fish baked in a paper parcel) with vegetables in a Beurre Blanc sauce. This was followed by a sumptuous lunch — sandwiches, pastries and cakes galore. The day was rounded off with Andrew

and Linda demonstrating how to make a painted chocolate chicken and caramel filled chocolates. It was fascinating.



We learnt a lot and came home with much knowledge, goody boxes filled with leftovers from the lunch and a delightful pack of beautifully decorated biscuits made by Linda.




