## The NFWI Annual Meeting to be held at the Royal Albert Hall London on Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> June 2024

The Annual Meeting will be held at the Royal Albert Hall on Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> June 2024.We will travel to London on Tuesday 4<sup>th</sup> June returning after breakfast on Thursday 6<sup>th</sup> June. We will be staying for two nights dinner, bed and breakfast at the Holiday Inn Shepperton, Delegates costs are paid for by all WI's. This year the calculated cost has been worked on a set rate per member not a sliding scale, this has been done because of the high cost of travel and accommodation in London.

The price each WI will be charged is £ 2.60 per member which would equate to a WI that has 20 members the charge would be £52, a WI with 50 members would be £130, these charges are considerably less than how the "shared accommodation "costs used to be. The list of the numbers has been taken from the MCS, this is another of the reasons it must be kept UpToDate. Letters will be in this mailing to all WIs with their individual charges Plus the amount that National require us to pay for Pooling of Fares which

If you recall in 2022, we did not make a charge for pooling of fares because we had paid the money from 2019 when the Annual Meeting of 2020 was cancelled due to COVID into a separate account and any money that remained in the account after the costs for the Liverpool Annual Meeting and the Cardiff AM in 2023 has been used to help towards the costs in 2024. The amount that remains in the bank for this purpose is £2100.

#### Annual Meeting 2024 continued

We have booked accommodation based on Twin Rooms and Single rooms, and these will be allocated on a first come first served basis. The single supplement for attendees is £100 for the two nights.

The Cost for two nights twin sharing will be £85 per night (£170 in total for two nights)

Single Occupancy rooms are £135 per night (£270 in total for two nights)

Delegates requiring a single room do need to pay the extra £100 supplement.

Non-Delegates/observer who wish to attend as visitors can obtain a ticket for £28 with a further cost of accommodation.

We do appreciate that the cost is high, which is why we have kept the quantity of booked rooms low, the coach is only a 33-seater, which provides us 20 delegate places, 3 Federation places and 10 visitor places. We cannot afford to have unsold accommodation.

#### The WI at the top of each group (in red) can send a delegate, or if your WI cannot provide a delegate you must pass on the responsibility by contacting the Federation Office at Alma House by email or telephone as soon as possible certainly no later than January 4th, 2024.

This year we are not providing a hybrid option at Alma House.

At this point I must explain the future of NFWI Annual Meetings, it is a very expensive event to deliver each year and National are continually reviewing ways in which the event can be maintained whilst minimising the costs. From 2025 NFWI will begin a continuous three-year cycle that will include two consecutive meetings for online participation only followed by one in person meeting at a larger venue allowing members to join both in person and online.

There will not be another in person meeting until 2027 Please take the opportunity to attend at this special venue in 2024.

We are pleased to confirm that the Charity Registration for the CIO has been completed. The board at their meeting on 11 October agreed to the transfer of all assets and to operate the new Charity from 1 Jan 2024, closing the existing charity as at 31 Dec 2023.

The key changes which affect WI's are :-

**Bank Account and Payments** The Bank Account sort code and account number will remain the same but the name on the account will no longer include the charity Number so will be **N Y W Fed of Womens Institutes No 1**. This name change will occur during December 2023 at a date not yet advised by the bank. We will implement a Booking Code Reference for all online payments to assist you indicating to us how the payment should be allocated and this will be included on all 2024 forms. This is due to the limited space allowed by bacs for you to include a payment reference

#### Follifoot WI - BSL Demonstration

Hearing members of Follifoot WI were introduced to the world of the deaf community and to communicating in British Sign Language in a talk by BSL interpreter Fiona Hudson.

They learned that one of the worst things you can say to a deaf or hearingimpaired person when they can't understand what you're saying is "It doesn't matter" or "I'll tell you later." This effectively excludes them from the conversation so you should always try to re-phrase, speak more clearly or finger- spell.

BSL is now recognised as a minority language and is the preferred language of 87,000 people. Fiona explained that she had first begun to learn BSL when girls from St John's School for the Deaf in Boston Spa joined her guide unit. After graduating in Deaf Studies and obtaining her BSL qualifications, she has interpreted for 20 years and now works at the University of Leeds and as a freelance interpreter. As well as practising lip-reading and signing with a partner, members learned about the different categories of deafness

and experienced what it was like to appreciate sounds after a cochlear implant. By the end of the meeting, members were able to order their tea, coffee and biscuits in BSL.
