A CHALLENGE has been thrown down to Women's Institute members in the Harrogate, Ripon and Skipton areas to double their membership over the next five years.

National chairman Mrs Agnes Salter told over 300 delegates at the annual meeting of the North Yorkshire West Federation to go out and sell the country's largest voluntary women's oversities into the hundred

A rousing chorus of Jerusalem greeted Harrogate Mayor Coun Douglas Muscroft who opened the event, being held at the town's Lounge Hall for the sixth time. He described the WI's work as "tremendous" but will have been disappointed to learn that the federation is moving the function to Ripon next year because it says it is cheaper and offers better featilities.

Pieces of embroidery, depicting work from each of the federation's 120 member institutes upheld the traditional "jam and Jerusalem" image of the organisation but guests were told that these days, members enjoyed wind-surfing and gliding and debated issues such as nuclear waste and rape.
