They were stringing up lines of rope from the old-fashioned lamp posts across the road and then covering them with tarpaulins and opened umbrellas to protect the line of tables and chairs down the middle of the street. It wouldn't be allowed to happen today with all the health and safety regulations we now have to abide by but back then everyone just got stuck in and did it. As soon as the programme finished, out

came the food and drink for the party and everyone was very upbeat despite the rain.

This time round we had a small impromptu street party in the sunshine on the Sunday afternoon as some of my neighbours came out and we got together to share party food and drink but it was an altogether much more low-key affair.

# Temple Balsall WI

Charles' Coronation. They partied at The Old Hall at Temple Balsall, with a delicious choice of homemade food provided by members and a glass of bubbly or two! A quiz tested royal knowledge, followed by a chat about the televised ceremony and some reminisced on the coronation of 1953. They recalled memories of the street parties, attended with their parents, and how they watched on a tiny screen of a black and white television. For many, it was the first crowning of a British monarch in their lifetime, and one that none of us will ever forget.



The late Queen, Elizabeth II, was a member of the

WI, as was her mother, Queen Elizabeth, the Queen Mother, and her grandmother, Queen Mary. Queen Elizabeth attended meetings at Sandringham WI in Norfolk and, in 1965, held a garden party at Buckingham Palace to celebrate the WI's Golden Jubilee. Our new Queen, Camilla, joined Tetbury WI near Highgrove House and Llandovery WI in Wales in 2006. Since 2021, she has been supporting the WI's campaign to end violence against women. This has included writing an article against domestic abuse for the organisation's magazine, WI Life. 
## **Fire Lighting and Cooking Workshop**


