Do you make New Year Resolutions? What do you do in January when it's cold and wet? Now is the time then to look at your WI Archives. We have recently received a large box of archive material from a WI who suspended in 2008 and closed in 2011. The large box had a number of different things but also had records and books from 1954 to 1987. They had been stored in one of the members' houses and had recently been found after she sadly passed away – luckily her family realised the value of the contents and brought them to us at WI House. The important paperwork is now on its way to the Northamptonshire County Records Office in Wootton. Unfortunately, WIs quite often lose their archive materials when they are not sorted regularly and they are dumped, probably after a member has passed away. Don't let this happen to your WI.

There are details of what you should and should not keep on MyWI. Definitely, your WI Committee Meeting minutes and Records of your Monthly meetings should be archived. How far back should you go – from the earliest to at least 10 years ago. You may have a big anniversary coming up – don't worry if the Records Office has them it is possible to borrow them for an exhibition. What you must do – make sure you note everything you are taking to the records office, keep a copy for your WI – perhaps keep with the secretary's papers in a separate file. Let WI House have a copy – we have a file of all records previously taken. When you take them to the Records office, make sure you get a receipt – again keep a copy with your WI and send a copy to the office – it will have a registration number.

Perhaps get some of your members together to have a 'clearing out' day. Some of the important do's and don'ts: do make sure any photos have names for the pictures, they are useless in the future if not ; the records office does not want Scrapbooks; try and take out all paperclips and staples, they will rust and stain the paperwork. Lastly, if you decide to keep your records, make sure you list what you are keeping, where it is going to be stored and that it is labelled as archives, to be taken to WI House if/when found. Please refer to the enclosed Archiving Information Sheet for further information.

Looking ahead to your WIs March Annual Meeting, a specimen Agenda will be in the February Newsletter. Item No 6 on the Agenda is Review of Decisions and Bye-Laws. All WIs have made decisions that should be reviewed annually and approved by the members. The four key WI Decisions are: -

Name of WI,

Date, Time and Place of WI Meeting

Number of members on the WI committee

Number of Vice Presidents

These key decisions are fundamental to the WI and can only be changed at an Annual or Special Meeting.

A few WIs have a Bye-law limiting the time their Officers serve. However, because Bye-laws can have unforeseen side effects, WIs should always notify the Federation Board of Trustees ahead of their discussion and adoption by the WI.

In addition to the key decisions above, there are other more minor 'decisions' to consider, such as the amount to charge visitors, what refreshments will be provided and if there will be a charge. Some WIs also discuss and decide whether to sing Jerusalem and how often, whether to read the record of the previous meeting (minutes) or send via email with copies available for those not on email, whether to have competitions and hold raffles, how often and what to charge. Your WI may have other items that could be included in your minor 'decisions' that would be relevant to you. If they are reviewed at every Annual Meeting they can be discussed and changed as appropriate.

A collection raised £260 to go towards the transport costs for the parcels. The presents are being sent to Nikopol in south east Ukraine. The town is close to the front line and is frequently under attack. The



children's care department will distribute the presents to children who have lost a parent, and the baby boxes will go to a maternity unit.
