Banking Issues

We are aware that Barclays Bank is requesting additional information and threatening account closures for small charity accounts causing WI treasurers/committees a number of issues regarding the continued operation of their WI bank Account. We have raised this matter at National WI level and they have confirmed they have raised the issues with The Charity Commission and the Bank, however due to confidentiality the Bank will only deal with the individual WI.

National WI can provide a letter signed by Jeryl Stone - National Treasurer confirming the status of a WI – apply to fd@nfwi.org.uk. A number of WIs both locally and nationally are raising the issue of lack of banking options for charities with their local MP –Julian Smith MP for Skipton and Ripon is aware of the issues and has requested any WI experiencing issues to please write to him, so he has further evidence to raise the issues or write to your local MP.

Do keep a record of any calls and responses and consider raising a formal complaint to the bank if you are not satisfied with their service—you may get financial compensation.

Knaresborough Banking Hub

In response to the closure of local branches – we have been informed Skipton Barclays is closing—the banks are starting to open banking hubs to provide a multibank offering – more are planned but dates of opening are not known. A radio programme indicated that they take 6-9 months to set up.

Knaresborough has the first of these open for full deposit and withdrawal arrangements at 15 Kirkgate, Bowling Green Yard is now open as follows for both personal and business including WI accounts:

Monday – National Westminster, Tuesday – Halifax, Wednesday - Santander, Thursday – HSBC, Friday – Barclays.


WI Charity Number

A number of older WIs registered with the Charity Commission and were issued with a charity number, but their committee elected in the past when their turnover fell below £5,000 to apply to be added to an "excepted" register thus negating the need to send annual reports to the Charity Commission. They are therefore not shown on the main register but accessible by calling the helpline on 0300 066 9197. WIs do not need to register if their income is less than £5,000. **Hazel Smyth, Federation Treasurer.**
