

Volunteering experience at The Great Yorkshire Show by Donna Galek, Ripon Belles & Madhatters WI member



I volunteered this year to steward at The Great Yorkshire Show and I was lucky enough to volunteer in the kitchen area too. I learnt so much about the wonderful ladies behind the

scenes and what a smooth operation occurred as they worked seamlessly to supply the public with a touch of

WI magic, O and scones!!

It all starts, I have learned, with an empty room, ladies appear to clean the area and then all the equipment that has been ordered is set up, everything from tables and chairs to ovens and fridges. In fact, it doesn't all start there because there is a committee behind the scenes who have put in the all-

important preparation, ensuring the requirements for the four days. The equipment and stores are all anticipated and ordered. It's a bit like an iceberg in that way, you don't see the whole.

Once you have washed your hands and donned your apron, a station is found for you, instructions given and you're off, pouring hot water for teas and coffee, bagging up scones, cakes or sandwiches, food preparation and most importantly washing up. We all pulled together to get the job done. Everyone gets their breaks, lunches are ordered, chatter ensues and friendships are formed. In contrast but just as interesting is the role of the steward. Questions are answered, raffle tickets are sold and competition entries are admired. People come to watch the demonstrators, different talents every day to entice and delight. Most importantly looking after the entries and explaining the judging.

I went home delighted to have been part of such a great team, tired but happy to have been included. I entered my first entry into the competition.

Yes I had lots of meltdowns making it and nearly

didn't submit, but I'm so glad I did. The judging was fair, and I learnt so much about WI competitions and judging. When making my entry, I never considered the challenges for the organisers to get everything to the show ground... and back to Alma House. o, thank you for the opportunity. Axe Throwing & Archery Course

at Biston Hall Action Centre on 25th June

Watercolour Painting for Beginners

We were warmly welcomed by Sara who introduced us to Gail our tutor for the day. Ten ladies and Sara took part. The room was light and airy. Gail had prepared the day so well and everything was meticulously organised.

Firstly, Gail outlined the required materials including brushes, paper and pigments.

Apparently the most used colour is cobalt

blue. We were given a sheet of watercolour paper divided into 4 and Gail demonstrated the use of washes. We practised painting washes with strict instructions not to go back and touch up. We then painted a copy of a winter scene by David Bellamy using only 1 pigment.

After lunch we chose from a selection of flowers and greenery. We sketched an outline in a prepared oval shape, looking very closely at our chosen flower before mixing colours to match. We felt very nervous before putting paint to paper and there was no time to chat we were all concentrating so much. We created paintings which we would never have thought possible at the beginning of the day. Before we knew it, it was time to wash our brushes and tidy up. Huge thanks to Gail for her excellent teaching, her patience and her ability to get the best out of us all and to Sara for looking after us all so well.
