On Thursday, 24 October over 30 members of the Beacon group attended the Autumn Group Meeting at Manston Village Hall. Andy Williams, Historian and Kingston Lacy National Trust guide gave another perspective of "The Story of the Bankes Family at Kingston Lacy".

In just over an hour, Andy gave us (with wonderful style and humour) not only a quick run-down of the family history of one of the most powerful families of Dorset who owned vast swathes of Dorset for over 400 years, but also added unusual facts and details. From fighting the forces of Oliver Cromwell & Brave Mary (was she Brave?) to gathering one of the world's largest collections of ancient Egyptian artefacts and graphite mines (no not for pencils) - the Bankes have a colourful past. The one message that Andy demonstrated was that the members of the family, from "Brave" Mary through to Henry John Ralph Bankes (1902 to 1981) ensured the estate remained as one and was not split.

A number of members are now going to revisit to see if they can find those cannons!
