Federation Rock Choir Update

I am aware that members are asking the question – "When will the choir restart"? I do completely understand the question, please let me explain the restrictions that are delaying the start.

- * Many of the WIs within the Federation are not having their first face-face meeting until the second and third week of September.
- * Many WIs have not had zoom meetings at all during the pandemic, which has prevented communication with members.
- * To allow all members to become involved I am asking any members who were in the choir in the past, or would like to join-please will you email me on nywfwi.bookings@btconnect.com with your expression of interest and contact details and which WI you are a member of. Using this email address allows me to keep all your emails separate to routine Federation business.
- * This will enable me to study the locality of all interested members, because as you are aware it was mentioned early 2020, we may have to go to one central locality for rehearsals. Sadly, Damien was leaving us in April 2020. and we were unable to find a replacement. I have been in contact with a present choir master and am hopeful that they will be able to continue.
- One of the other considerations is that we must be financially viable. Our payments for halls and tutors must be covered by our individual term payments. The choir is not subsidised by the Federation.

Once I have all the information from you, and there is sufficient interest, I can proceed with arranging a venue.

Booking details will be announced with a start date in January 2020. I appreciate you would have preferred an earlier start date, but we do not have a paid employee in place yet and the office is at present being run by

Public Affairs Committee update

As some of you may be aware once again one of our own Federation WI have submitted a very important Resolution to National and I will be attending a meeting in October when all the Resolutions including ours will be discussed and a short list decided on. It goes without saying I shall, of course, be batting for us.

With regard to this year's Resolution which is now an NFWI mandate and will form the basis of a national WI campaign which we are all invited to work on. National are producing a full campaign action pack and should you wish information on this, I am happy to help. Some of you might say what happens to all the work done on Resolutions? Do you remember our campaign End Plastic Soup. The NFWI Public Affairs Department have been working alongside government and a report lists six recommendations for Government, which if implemented would significantly reduce the volume of microfibres from laundry emitted into the environment. 35 different groups have been chosen to send this information. This report will be available for all members to read. As a Federation we are supporting the Stitches for Survival movement, who are going to produce a road of messages for the Climate Change Conference in November. On the 24th September I shall be taking any contributions to Skipton to the Yarn Event. Remember it has to be ideally 60 x 100 cm but Grassington Climate Group say they could sew the following combinations together 30 x 50 or 60 x 50. National have also put together a pack for members with information about how to get involved, including the 'No More Loopholes Bracelet craft action. Information on this is on My WI.

Don't forget Green Week 18 – 26 September

The WI will be supporting The Climate Coalitions plans for the Great Big Green Week from 18 - 26th September 2021. This will be a national week of events on climate action!

You could organise a community stall, a park clean-up or get together to do some planting in your local area or perhaps have a coffee morning to highlight important issues. 


Here are some of our WI ladies
