

2023 is a very important year for North Yorkshire West Federation, it is the 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the changes to



During May and June your Trustees are going to 4 venues throughout the region to meet up with you, it will be a social occasion with light refreshments. The venues are, Long Preston, Crakehall, Alma House, and Dacre Village Hall. There will be more news in next month's newsletter.

It will be Spring Council on Saturday April 22<sup>nd</sup> at Tennant's, it will be a two-course lunch and the Afternoon speaker will be TV presenter David Harper (I avoided describing him as Antique TV Presenter!)

All details are on the front cover.

The Annual Meeting will be at St David's Hall in Cardiff, a much smaller venue than normal, this is because at Liverpool 2022 there was over a 1/3 of seats empty, these had to be paid for. It is not just the Federation who to carefully budget for all events. As I mentioned in our recent news email, because of our number of delegate numbers being cut by 50%. who opted to watch the meeting on zoom (all delegates were given a choice) the federation have decided not to ask all WI's to pay the Pooling of Fares and Shared Accommodation charges, we still have funds from the cancelled 2020 payments which we will retain towards payments for 2024 which will be held at the Royal Albert Hall in London. Retaining of the Funds will then go towards costs for attendance

It looks as though we have lots to look forward to!

But back to issues from 2022

Federation Choir- I have contacted all members of the choir to inform them about claiming the outstanding refunds. Because of Covid the Spring Term was cut short, the payments we had received were held in a separate account with the hope we could reform the choir at some point, for various reasons I have not been able to achieve this, Never say Never! There are still unclaimed refunds and some ladies have donated their refunds to the federation- Thank you ladies for your generosity in these difficult times.

This is Kathryn's winning short story below:

## **Community**

I entered the village hall to the sound of trestle tables rumbling like fledgling thunderstorms, as they were being dragged across the floor... Lids from shiny tea urns rattled along with insistent chatter, from gathered volunteers, in danger of drowning out a crackling radio on the windowsill.

"You're on the welcoming table." A voice called out.

"Ok," I answered, as I admired the bright yellow sunflowers on tables, their cheerful faces following the sun which streamed through the glass dome, overhead.

Then unexpectedly it hit me - I couldn't swallow, my eyes pricked with moisture, together with a dread in the pit of my stomach as I remembered... Years ago, in this same room, flowers on tables... however these were poppies a host of vibrant poppies straining like soldiers in red uniforms towards the sunlight.

I recalled searching for signs of familiarity as I entered this place for the first time and my body relaxed somewhat, as I spied these flowers of my homeland... Poland torn apart by war from which I had fled, leaving everything and everybody behind...

A flower this community had carefully chosen to say - "Welcome... We care." It spoke volumes to me!

Armed with little English, images of crumbling buildings, broken glass and scattered toys playing in my head. I stood, in about the same spot, the acrid smell of burning clinging to my clothes... My heart pounding, as I stared in bewilderment at these unfamiliar surroundings...

I was in a small building on the edge of a village. I would later come to know this as the community hall. Through the picture window sheep grazed on a hillside and stone walls adorned fields as far as the eye could see. A world away from the devastation I had left!

Shortly a rosy cheeked woman approached, bearing an enormous smile and portraying a kindness and assurance, which conveyed she could solve any problem thrown in her direction, she spoke warmly as she addressed my trembling self....

## Kathryn Anderson's short story continued...

"Hello, what is your name?"

"Anya Koval." I whispered, nervously.

The years have passed, my memory is hazy, or maybe my brain is safeguarding me. However, I did begin to feel a little better on that day. I gave more family information, albeit in broken English, but the villagers were patient and kind, often smiling when we recognised a similar word or phrase.

The community held me in it's arms at a time when I needed holding. They provided me with a home, food, unwavering kindness, love and support. Now, after all these years as an active member of the community it is my turn to provide the care and kindness to people fleeing from another war, how sad we never learn...

I stare at the sunflowers the community have grown specially, to welcome and say we care... We are starting here, with the flowers, but our community can and will do much more if you'll let us.

Some members asked for the chicken recipe, so here it is!

## <u>Chicken Supremes with Madeira</u> <u>and Grapes</u>

## **Ingredients**

6 chicken supremes or thighs
15 ml (1 tbsp) oi
55g (2 oz) butter
1 large onion, finely chopped
Orange juice (equivalent to juice of 2 small oranges)
150 ml (1/4 pint) dry white wine
55 ml (2 fl oz) Madeira
450 ml (3/4 pint) chicken stock
Salt and pepper
340g (12 oz) seedless grapes
30 ml (2 level tbsp) cornflour



Chopped parsley to garnish

#### Method

- Preheat oven to 170°C, 350°F, Gas 4
- Heat oil and butter in casserole dish.
   Brown chicken. Remove onto plate.
- Reduce heat, add chopped onion and cook until soft but not brown. Add orange juice, wine, Madeira, stock and seasoning. Stir well.
- Return chicken to casserole, bring to the boil, cover and cook in oven for approx. 40 mins. Stir in grapes and continue cooking for a further 5-10 mins. Remove chicken.
- Blend cornflour with a little cold water, stir into sauce, bring to the boil, stirring. Replace chicken. Adjust seasoning if necessary, sprinkle with parsley.
- Serve.
