I thought all you keen photographers out there might like to know a little more about the result of the Trustees Trophy and how I judged the entries. The winning entry was by Yvonne Glowacz of Allesley WI. The subject of 'trees' was clearly popular as there were more than forty entries and all of them were really good, but unfortunately, there could be only one winner!

When assessing the photos, I was looking for adherence to the brief, technical ability (of course), composition, impact of the subject and the story that the photo told. Of course, the right photo can break all the so-called rules if it's striking enough! Thinking about the brief first – the subject was trees in the plural – not tree, and there were many first-class photographs of a single tree - old trees, dead trees, interestingly shaped trees and trees from novel angles.

I will own up at this point and apologise that in trying to illustrate my criteria, my hasty re-photographing of the entries in situ is far from perfect and has resulted in the blazing out of the top of the winning entry.

The trees which spoke to me loudest were these two trunks with branches intertwined ... there was upward movement there and it told the story of these two trees growing together. Importantly, the photo was technically sound, in focus and even showed a glimpse of background between the branches, lightening

might otherwise have appeared quite dark. I was drawn into the story, trying to work out which branches went where and how the two were related.

In quite a few very good photographs, the impression was of a beautiful landscape in which there were trees - whereas I felt that the brief called for the trees to be the dominant element.

Many photographs were excellent and prompted me to name a few runners up, such as the only twilight photo with beautiful trees in silhouette. Others had found trees with beautifully shaped branches, highly textured bark, often dead trees, and some people used the added effects of water to create beautiful reflections.

Many more are worthy of recognition and I believe all photographers should feel proud of the effort they've made.

Delighted and proud to report that Hawne WI won a Spotlight Kindness Award for Stepping up in the Community.





Monkspath & Silhill WI - A History Walk with Ian Jelf

On 19th October (2022), 23 members of Monkspath and Silhill Institutes gathered in front of Saint Alphege church for a fascinating journey back in time. Heart of England "Blue Badge" tourist guide Ian Jelf led us on our voyage.



Snippets of information about Sir Christopher Wren, brawling clergymen, the "Traitor of Arden", Samuel Johnson's rejected application for head of Solihull School, powdered custard and Princess Margaret's 1954 visit were shared as we wandered 2 miles around the centre of the "Urbs-in-Rure".

lan talked to us in front of the George Hotel which dates from the 16th century and was once a coaching inn. The old bowling green behind the hotel dates from the 1600's and is perhaps the oldest Crown Green in the country.





We learned about the Malvern and Brueton families as we wandered into the park. The Horse and Master Statue was created in 1874 by sculptor, Joseph Edgar Boehm.

As we continued our meandering around the town, we discovered the site of Solihull's First Police Station on New Road, first wedding where the couple left the ceremony in a motor car, a Memorial to Workers' killed at the workplace, the old Parish Workhouse on Warwick Road (later moved to the current site of Solihull Hospital).

We ended our walk at The Manor House in the centre of Solihull, where several of us then stopped for lunch in the Tea Room. The Manor house was built around 1495 by the Greswold Family but has never actually been home to any 'Lord of the Manor'. It was purchased by a public trust in 1945 and saved from demolition.

An Embroidered Sampler

For the 2023 Montgomery Shield Competition you are asked to produce and embroidered sampler. This can be a traditional cross stitch design, or a decorative sampler book displaying several stitches or designs such as Sashiko Embroidery. The important thing is that it must be decorative!

For the **Traditional Sampler** extra consideration will be given if the design is original. If you are working from a kit this must be clearly stated on the entry form. The finished piece of work must be mounted and framed; you do not want a judge to mark the back of your work! The work to be no bigger than A3.

For a **Decorative Sampler**, this can be displayed in the form of a fabric book but do make sure that the back of your work is neat and tidy. The finished size to be no larger than A4.

Judging for the Montgomery Shield will take place at the Annual Meeting, which will be taking place in September 2023. A wide range of ideas and inspiration can be found on google images. Expressions of interest are to be emailed to Debbie Arkinstall at

- Get to know if anyone near you is alone and invite them around for a coffee or a meal
- Make sure that your Christmas tree and any biodegradable decorations go to compost
- Start preparing for Show the Love in February 2023.
- Minimise your use of plastic: think about plastic in toys

If you're looking around for an activity this autumn, why not knit or sew yourself draught excluders for any doors that need them? As an example, there's a very simple pattern with tips on fillings on this website, but you hardly need a pattern at all. https://craftysewingsew.co.uk

There are also many examples of commercially available draught excluding seals for doors and windows and some can be fixed quite easily.
