This month we don't have any special events as lambing takes priority at this household.

The Norah Worth competition, I was delighted this year to receive 12 entries and these have now been judged by Margot Atkinson one of our County Judges whose specialist field is wool, so who better to judge, resulting this year of 2 joint winners as both entries were according to brief/schedule — 100g of Double Knitting wool and the quality of workmanship was excellent. All entries will be on display at Spring Council at Hampsthwaite Memorial Hall and from there they can be collected. Those that are not collected will be returned to Alma House.

Normally at this time of year details of the Lady Denman Cup Competition is announced, a competition which has been very popular with many of our members. We've achieved 1st and 2nd positions plus many highly recommended over the years, sadly this year this is what we have received from National—The Lady Denman Cup competition has seen a considerable decline in entries over the past 5 years, so it has been decided (by National) that for this year (2024) it will be suspended. This will allow us time to research and learn why members no longer want, or are able, to enter the competition and create an inspiring programme of creative writing courses via the Hub. So if you normally enter have any constructive comments please don't hesitate to let either myself or the Office know, then we can forward them to National.

Resolutions: As you will see National have now sent out the final resolution that will be voted on at the Annual Meeting. The resolution is Dental Health Matters, (*There is a chronic shortage of NHS Dentists and people are suffering health issues as a result. The NFWI calls on the Government to increase investment in the training and retention of dentists and to review the current inadequate NHS contracts in order to ensure everyone can access an NHS dentist wherever they live). The votes for this resolution were 37,772 which was 39.6% of those who voted. Each WI now needs to discuss this resolution and decide how they wish their link delegate to vote at the Annual Meeting. 
