Cathryn Marsh – Vice Chairman





Dear Iris and Board of Trustees



Are you having trouble with your ears?

I've been struggling with my ears sticking out every time I wear my face mask; I think my elastic is too tight or else my head is too big!

I mentioned this to Jan Parkes, Member of Great Barr WI who suggested I may benefit from a bit of crochet? So here are instructions on how to make a much comfier option for securing your face mask.

Instructions for an Ear Aid for your Face mask – From Jan Parkes, Great Barr WI

20 chain treble all way around 5 at each end stitch then dc all way round. Stick on buttons with cast on and cast-off wool. An alternative is a strip of material about 5-6 inches long stitched in couple layers and buttons on each end for people who do not crochet.

A First Adventure! by Liz Galloway.

The current health crisis and various forms of lockdown have caused me to reminisce about holidays enjoyed in the past. A great early summer has turned, rather suddenly, into a cold, wet and windy autumn and I long to travel to sunnier climes, *as I'm sure many of you do!*

I remember my first adventure, almost sixty years ago – overland to Rome, in an Austin Mini with three other *young ladies* and a heavily laden roof-rack. Two of my friends were nurses – *the medical support team!* It was a finely organised expedition – personal luggage allowance in the door pockets and the camp kitchen and tinned/dried food for three weeks filling the boot. Bell tent, sleeping bags, water carrier and so on were on the roof, together with mallet and fire extinguisher (needed later to ward off amorous Italians!) *Cost of the whole trip - £30 each!*

After Paris to Grenoble (by autorail), our brave little Mini bore us valiantly up and over the Mont Cenis Pass into Italy, although it did suffer shortness of breath in the thin air at the top! Stopping for rest and a picnic, we found an idyllic turquoise lake with wild lilies and mountain flowers all around - water bottles cooled in the sparkling icy stream.

On through Turin and the Autostrada del Sol towards Rome. In Rome, we linked up with relatives and were shown the sights, often at terrifying speed sitting side-saddle on the back of a Vespa scooter!

With a besom broom as a souvenir, tied to the roof-rack, we set off north, causing much amusement as we went! Our next stop, Venice was amazing. We walked miles through the back streets, on one occasion missing the night ferry across the lagoon and sleeping in the Piazza San Marco until the first ferry at dawn. An interesting insight into the abandoned piazza – only wide-broomed cleaners and stray cats!

Onwards and upwards to the beautiful Lake Como where a seasonal storm funnelled down the lake and blew our tent away. Next day, we joined in an informal trade of belongings, clothes, underwear etc with other campers - we weren't the only ones caught out! And so, it continued to rain as we crossed the Alps and our tent was soaked, finally drying out on the north shore of Lake Geneva. So, on to Calais!

I remember our return through British Customs well. A group of young Officers were delighted to see us and clearly thought it would be entertaining to take us apart. They asked us to empty everything, boot, door pockets (including dirty washing) and roof rack. Little did I realise at the time that they were allowed to literally take the car apart, engine and all, if they chose ... and were NOT required put it back together again

.... now that might have been testing!

NFWI developed a partnership with IAM RoadSmart which resulted in a number of successful driving events being held around the country. Over a 3 year period, over 1500 members took part in various driving experiences, all proven to help develop and improve women's road confidence; from speed awareness, driving at night and motorway driving

Following lockdown and continual changes to government restrictions, the NFWI felt that now more than ever, members would be interested in the benefits that our partnership with the IAM RoadSmart could offer. Getting back behind the wheel, with heavier traffic, will require more caution especially as many drivers may feel out of practise or may have lost some confidence in their competence.

NFWI and IAM RoadSmart have been working together closely, sharing knowledge and experience, to put together a programme of activities, bespoke for the WI, that offer a variety of opportunities which members could access to help them improve, or reassure them of, their driving skills. However, before we launch our programme, we want to be sure that what we are offering is exactly what members of the WI want by completing the suvey. This should no more than 5 minutes and the results of this will help us build a programme that meets the needs and interest of members, both short-term and long-term.

Thank you for supporting and contributing towards the development of a new programme of opportunities for WI members. I look forward to sharing the feedback from the survey, and our proposed responsive actions, in the coming months.
