Thanks to the skills of trustee Paula Pierce Shropshire Federation arranged several virtual events. Others have made the effort to acquire those skills and are now busy organising further events. Individual WIs have held their own virtual meetings.

Not every member has access to digital media but they should all have received WI Life which has been sent out as usual. SFWI newsletters have been produced throughout the pandemic as well as extra entertainment for the period over Christmas. WI officers and committees have kept in touch with members by whatever means at their disposal - email, telephone, post. Birthday cards and Christmas gifts have been sent out. Some WIs have organised "meeting in a bag" deliveries and small gatherings when these have been allowed.

### WhatsApp

I need to start by saying I am not an expert and cannot advise on anything technical! However my experience of WhatsApp has prompted me to share my thoughts. Quite a few WIs have formed

WhatsApp groups and feel it has helped them during the last year and many members are part of other groups which keep them in touch with family and friends.

WhatsApp is a free, online messaging service. I use it on my mobile phone but it can be used on other devices. It uses the Internet to send and receive messages, voice calls, images and video calls. All messages are secure, can only be seen by senders and recipients, and no personal data is stored.

A study, by researchers at Edge Hill University, has found that interacting with friends and family is good for a person's psychological health; they have higher self- esteem and less loneliness. I think WI members probably know this.

Since lockdown, as SFWI Flower Show Committee haven't yet been able to follow their usual agenda., they set up a Whats App group to get now know each other better. You would be surprised at the range of topics covered. It started with elderflower cordial making, and posts have included recipes, marmalade making, paintings, photographs, jokes and wildlife observations. Anxieties, triumphs and ideas have been shared and they have become a tight knit group, despite only managing to meet up in person twice (outside).

If you've got a Smartphone download WhatsApp from the App store and follow the instructions. I've just learnt how to use it by using it.

Have you heard the exciting news that Shropshire is aiming to be net zero carbon by 2030, twenty years ahead of the UK government's zero carbon plan?


We're leading the way forward!


# Zoom Thursday 25 March 1.00 p.m.


