

Firstly thankyou to all the members who have responded to the GYS request, unfortunately as we go to press no one has come forward with a Catering background to offer help on a daily basis on site on one or more show days to help with general organisation of the daily routine /work rota of all the volunteers which is such a vital position for the smooth running of the cafeteria area, The exhibition section has been offered more help pre the show and also during the show, with the setting up. judging and general organisation of what is required .

All the comments from many of those who have already responded have said it would be such a shame not to keep the WI tradition continuing, as so many of the visitors look forward to participating in all we offer. So if you have not already offered help there is still time as the decision will not be made until the 12th November.

Secondly, as yet there has been no response to my request for members to come forward to join the Board or even enquire what it entails, please don't hesitate if you want to know more as the proposed changes to the WI Governing Documents for a Federation Board states that it must have a minimum of 8 members. If by the 12th April 2025 we don't have that number, National could suspend our Federation, which I am sure none of us would want to happen.

We have just received notice from National that the AM will be held on the 4th June 2025 starting 10.00am via Zoom. Voting will be conducted on Election Buddy, a secure on line voting platform, all Delegates require a personal device (smartphone or tablet) Laptop or Tablet - a device to run zoom, preferably with a screen for better viewing.

We have been allocated 19 Delegate places, as it is too late in this publication to give you the Delegate Linking list, we will be sending out the information via a News Flash very shortly as we have to send all the details back to National before the 28th February 2025.

At the same time we will explain what the Federation will be proposing to offer for the Delegates also more information. explaining there will be additional tickets at £5.00 also group tickets at £20.00.

Those of us who took the Food Hygiene Certificate 3 years ago it expires in February 2025, it is proposed to offer another course or anyone who wishes to complete another certificate. Details to follow shortly.





Autumn Lunch On 9th October 2024 at Tennants Garden Rooms, Leyburn







The morning started with an amazing rendition of Jerusalem which equalled the volume of singing at the Royal Albert Hall. Our morning speaker was Dianne Sinnott, who has been the 20th century design specialist and general valuer for Tennants for 22 years. Dianne spoke passionately about what her position entails and regaled us with memorable events including a a commission to value a collection of deer memorabilia. This collection was stored in a cold and draughty museum and ranged from mugs with deer transfers on to a 12' high skeleton complete with antlers. Another story concerned a reputedly original Chinese vase which was found on top of a bookcase in a house full of children, dogs and cats. At auction the vase sold for £2.6 million. The talk was supported by slides including the library of the old Leeds Girls' grammar school and showed several tables by Robert (Mouseman) Thompson with eight chairs around each one. Every piece was embellished with the famous mouse, each of which took 40 minutes to carve.

Julie Clarke followed this with an impassioned plea for volunteers to help with the Great Yorkshire Show next year. Several members had expressed an interest in helping for two days but didn't want to book hotel accommodation. Other members had rooms to spare so hopefully everyone was matched up and we will have more names on the list of potential helpers. We all enjoyed a delicious meal with a delicate dessert selection of cakes with more than a few ladies enjoying a glass of wine with their lunch.

The afternoon's entertainment was provided by Nicola Mills with 'Opera for the People'. Nicola told how she came from a very poor background where there was no money for singing lessons. Fortunately one of her infant school teachers spotted her amazing voice and encouraged her. Nicola's range includes everything from opera, classical and musicals to popular music and we were invited to join in. Her career ranged from working all over the world to finally becoming freelance and busking outside Fortnum and Mason on Oxford Street. At the end of her recital there was a rush to buy copies of her CD which were well worth the donation.

All in all it was a memorable occasion and we look forward to returning to Tennants next year for the spring council meeting. This is one of the best venues to hold such a meeting as there is room to move around, plenty of toilets and ample parking.
