# **'Recipe Corner'**

Our new feature recipe corner, when space allows we will feature a tried and tested recipe for our readers. Here is our first recipe submitted by Trustee Jean Cox.

Bean & Tomato Soup – a quick healthy winter warmer, high in fibre and low in salt and sugar.

Serves 4

2 Celery sticks, finely chopped/1 small onion, finely chopped/Sprig of fresh thyme

575ml (1 pint) vegetable stock/400g can of tomatoes/200g can of baked beans in tomato sauce/Worcester sauce to taste/Salt and black pepper and fresh parsley to garnish

Method

- 1. Cook the celery, onion and thyme in a small amount of stock until tender.
- 2. Puree the tomatoes and beans until smooth.
- 3. Mix the tomato mixture into the celery and onions, add remaining stock, add Worcestershire sauce and seasoning to taste.
- 4. Remove thyme, bring to the boil and simmer for 5 minutes before serving
- 5. Delicious with some crusty bread on a cold evening!
