The Great Food Debate - where next?

Dear Members,

As you will know, the Public Affairs committee recently held our Great Food Debate at the Morlan Centre in Aberystwyth. Speakers were interesting and varied on the topic of food quality and sustainability locally and nationally.

The various speakers covered many points but the main problems upon which WI members could bring their influence to bear on the Supermarkets were as follows:-

- In order to keep the Carbon Footprint of staple foods as low as possible the large retailers of these products should be encouraged to buy from local producers who, knowing that they had a reliable outlet, would be more than capable of meeting demand. This would lead to the consumer having full knowledge of provenance when making purchases. This applies particularly to meat, vegetables, eggs, bread and milk wherever possible.
- 2. As WI members committed to a sustainable food supply and with a membership of some 212,000 we do have considerable consumer ability to vote with our feet if we consider that not enough is being done to deal with the problem of sustainable food production and it is with this in mind that we would also urge all major retailers to deal more satisfactorily with the tremendous waste of food which occurs on a daily basis. This again is largely because instead of buying locally, food is travelling long distances and therefore its shelf life is reduced. However, much of the wastage of food comes about through sell by and best before dates being applied to such things as vegetables which if purchased locally would not need to be chilled and would keep much longer.
- 3. W I members feel that the current system of food supply presents considerable obstacles to local producers and distributors in delivering local food to Ceredigion's consumers
