**Langtoft WI Finds Hidden WI Treasure!** Three members of Langtoft WI, South Lincolnshire Federation were lucky enough to be invited to the Imperial War Museum (IWM), Duxford to view the huge tapestry that was made by the WI in celebration of the work of women in World War II. We went for a day out and we came away absolutely amazed by this item of WI heritage. It is nothing short of breath taking and we want as many people to know about it as possible, as it needs to be seen to be believed! Not only has the tapestry successfully captured the roles of women in World War II in a unique way, but it is also a work of art in its own right. The story of its inception and creation is almost as important as the images it displays. This tapestry was designed and created with care and devotion *by* women *in celebration* of women and, since the role of women in World War II is still largely unsung, the story of the WI tapestry deserves to be told with enormous pride. There is no doubt that the IWM archive is doing a great job of preserving this tapestry. But surely the purpose of the tapestry was to tell its story with such vibrancy and artistry that it would stay in the hearts and minds of those who saw it forever. We cannot think of a better way of celebrating the work of women in World War II for VE75 than by exhibiting the tapestry so that new generations can view it and share the sense of admiration and pride that we felt when we saw it. You never know, your WI may have worked on one of the panels!
