With five star book reviews this is an afternoon you won't want to miss!



Ingredients

For The Sponge: 220g soft butter or margarine 220g caster sugar 4 eggs beaten 220g self-raising flour sifted 1tsp vanilla extract 2tbsp milk (optional) For The Filling: 400ml clotted cream 100ml double cream Blueberry jam Strawberry jam 200g Strawberries 100g Blueberries

Equipment

3 x 20cm round cake tins greased and lined



Method

- 1. Pre heat the oven to 180°C/350°F/Gas Mark 4
- 2. Cream together the butter and sugar until light and fluffy; gradually beat in the eggs.
- 3. Add the vanilla essence and lightly fold in the flour.
- 4. Loosen the mixture with milk if needed the mixture should drop easily from the spoon.
- 5. Divide the mixture evenly between the tins and level. Bake for 25-30 mins until risen and lightly browned. A skewer inserted in the middle should come out clean. Transfer to a wire rack to cool.
- 6. Combine the clotted & double cream in a bowl. If the mixture is too runny gently whisk by hand until it forms soft peaks.
- 7. Spread one sponge generously with blueberry jam then a thick layer of cream. Be careful not to spread to the very edge of the cake or it will spill out when you add the next layer!
- 8. Place a second layer on top of the first, gently pressing down until level.
- 9. Spread the 2nd layer with strawberry jam, followed by cream and the final layer of sponge.
- 10. Spread remainder of cream on the top of cake and decorate with fresh berries in the shape of a Union Jack.
