

# Gift Aid

Gift Aid can be claimed on WI subscriptions if the member pays more Tax than any reclaimed Gift Aid. Enclosed is a Gift Aid Form for 2023 subscriptions and once signed by the member allows the WI to reclaim for the current year/future years and up to 4 years of past subscriptions is back to 2019. However note that the WI can only claim on the **WI portion of the subscription** in **2023 that is £22.60** (prior to 2018 it was on the whole subscription) which can mean an extra £5.65 for your funds. Note if your WI has/is charging less that the full WI portion of the subscription Gift Aid can only be claimed on the amount charged

Enclosed is a leaflet explaining how to set up and claim Gift Aid – we will help you set up/answer queries including forwarding information to allow Federation and National to claim on the rest of the subscription.

# Accounts Spreadsheet – tips

A version of the Accounts Spreadsheet with totals in the headings as well as line 250 is available to download at <u>https://yorkshire-north-west.thewi.org.uk/forms-download</u> which may help checking inputs.

- Value not added into Total check that value only has one "." decimal point before the pence
- Delegate/Courses paid by WI rather than members are not recorded in Column 5 – Fees as Agent
- Check the Year to Date sheet to confirm monies payable to Federation have matched.

That's why I am excited to invite you and your federation to take part in Walk in Her Name, (www.ovarian.org.uk/walkinhername) a fundraising event to support ovarian cancer awareness and research.
