The office at WI House is usually a hive of activity and certainly was up until 23 March of this year when the country went in to lockdown due to Covid-19. This meant re-organising with staff mainly working from home and ensuring only one member of staff at a time would be in the office. Claire was able to work from home straightaway and Jackie just going in to WI House as needed to open post and doing the admin work not able to be done from home. Tina was in as usual on a Wednesday and Friday to do the accounts and any banking.

The Government changed the Furloughing rules towards the end of May which meant that any staff who had not been put on Furlough by the 10 June could not be

brought back part time from the 1 July – 31 October. The Officers made the decision, after talking to the staff, to furlough all of them on 10 June. On 1 July they all returned to work, Jackie and Claire from home with Tina in the office, all working vastly reduced hours to normal. The dedication, loyalty and keenness of all the members of staff to adapt to the challenging times we found ourselves in made the transition as smooth as possible. CAMPAIGNS and CONCERNS

I am pleased to report a good attendance of committee members at the four meetings held this year, with requests to attend as observers from three WI Members. Jo Stephenson was elected as Vice Chairman of the committee, but has since sadly, due to personal reasons, resigned from the committee. We thank her for her input. The other members of this committee bring enthusiastic input to meetings, with various skills all so vital for our success.

An article has been submitted each month to the NCFWI News, by the Chairman of the committee, to inform and update members on the progress and action taken on NFWI Resolutions.

We organised an event looking at Climate Change and the garden, which also was taking in the beneficial effects of gardening and wildlife on mental health issues but, sadly, this had to be cancelled due to Covid 19.

Members of the committee have supported and promoted food banks, attended Show the Love events, promoted Campaigns at coffee mornings and the AGM.

Our Climate Ambassadors continue to give talks to WIs and engage with members with articles in the NCFWI Newsletter. Members recently took part in a Virtual Lobby of Parliament organised by the Climate Coalition to promote a green recovery after the pandemic. Unfortunately, events have been cancelled where we would have been able to engage with the public, i.e. Blakesley Show. Our Climate Ambassadors attended a Transition Town Northampton Film Night and raised the profile of the WI's involvement in Climate Change. They also were at a Daventry District Council emergency planning meeting where these issues were raised, also the need for public transport solutions. The committee is already looking at ways of working on the two new resolutions agreed by NFWI this year and plan an innovative and exciting future.

Our ACWW Officer, Jean Bates, continues to promote ACWW in an article in each NCFWI Newsletter, and offers talks to WI meetings. This offer has been taken up by many WIs this year, but

some cancelled due to the restrictions in place. The members of Northamptonshire Federation of WIs continue to collect items for recycling for charity and the monies gained that way have contributed also to donations from WIs to ACWW. Members have, on occasion, chosen which WE Fund they wish their contributions to support and can follow the projects on line. Plans for the Midlands Supporters Group meeting were cancelled this year.

Diana Babb, our Resolutions Officer, has kept members informed of the selection procedures for new resolutions, with articles in NCFWI Newsletter, and encouraged members to consider submitting resolutions.

DENMAN COLLEGE

Well the report this year is of gloom!! – a case of two halves! During the latter months of 2019 things were on a very even keel – with predictions of a good inroad into our deficit. The new Head of Denman - Anupreet Jeetun, was slowly turning Denman's fortunes around. Obviously not everything he introduced was liked by all, but in the main it was definitely starting to show good results. Yes, student numbers were sometimes lower than would have been liked, but the outside events were making up for this. The cream teas continued to be a big draw (and very good they were too) and extra events for members and non-members to enjoy were also a sell-out, plus we were getting a good reputation for Weddings, birthday parties and wakes! – all these events added a great atmosphere to the College.

Our September sale was, as usual, a great success adding much appreciated cash into the teaching centre. We do have a great team of helpers – 'baggers and taggers', 'movers, shakers and humpers' and a great selling team. We had a lot of priced up stock ready for the March 2020 sale which did not happen and then the now cancelled September one.

In the Autumn we held a special raffle for Denman which many members contributed to, so thank you for that. At least you will be spared that this year!

At the beginning of the year a decision was made to strip the bedrooms of their individuality, as it was felt that if we were to be open more to the general public it should be more corporate (boring!!!!) – our precious items might be stolen and obviously would not be appreciated by Joe Bloggs! – all 'by the by' now.

Plans were in place for Northamptonshire to have another Federation visit in March 2021 and applications were starting to come in. Now sadly cancelled.

In March, well - Covid 19 arrived and the rest is history as they say. Obviously, Denman had no choice but to close and although it was hoped to open up from 1 July, again this was not to be, and as there seemed no end to this pandemic the future looked very uncertain. Staff were furloughed, and

now sadly face redundancy as the decision has been made to close Denman. As I write, this is still in the consultation period, but I fear, this will be the outcome.

The one bright spark on the horizon is the success of the Denman at Home programme. These are a variety of 1- or 2-hour courses, viewed via Zoom on the internet. There has been a good mix on offer, from yoga and crafts to cookery and history. They are priced at £5 a session and have proved extremely popular. For the time being these at least will continue.

However, questions are being asked every day and I am hoping Federations will at least put some

pressure on NFWI to question their decision again - but I do fear we are about to lose the Jewel in our Crown – the Jewel that over the last 72 years has been a haven and a safe place of learning for women of all ages – the one thing all organisations envied us for. Our forebears worked so hard to achieve this college and we are about to throw it away and we will NEVER get it back.
